

Dublin Walking Tour

Head out to enjoy a walking tour with a local private guide through this vibrant capital city, with its mix of 1,000 years of architecture from the Medieval to Georgian, right through to the modern. See the Georgian style Merrion Square, lush St. Stephen's Green and Fitzwilliam Square, as well as O'Connell Street, the site of the 1916 Uprising that led to Ireland's independence in 1922.

Your guide is a local historian who will bring the city to life with colourful tales of life in the city in times gone by

Dublin is a city that's as intimate as a village and as friendly as an Irish pub. Framed by mountains, centred on a river and edged by a beautiful bay, the city's streets and alleys are filled with vibrant art and historic buildings, hip cafés and traditional "old man" pubs, as Dubliners call them. Gobbins Cliff Path & The Causeway Coast

A dramatic coastal hiking experience

Today, tackle one of the most dramatic hikes in Europe, the Gobbins Path. Originally opened in 1902, it was later abandoned in the 1960s until it's rebirth in 2015. Traverse hidden tunnels under the Irish Sea, climb rugged staircases carved into the cliff face and duck into caves once home to smugglers and privateers.

Admire castle ruins, dramatic cliffs, stunning beaches and picturesque harbours and even visit a few places that inspired and appeared on HBO's *Game of Thrones*. The grand finale is at the spectacular Giant's Causeway – octagonal columns of rocks created by feuding giants or volcanic activity – myth or science, you decide!

DAY 7

Rathlin Island Boat Trip

An island of myth and mystery

Sail along the Causeway Coast to Rathlin Island – many tales of myth and mystery surround Rathlin Island, though the most famous tells of Robert the Bruce. In 1306, the Scottish King was driven from Scotland by Edward I of England and took refuge on Rathlin where he watched a spider persevering again and again to bridge a gap with its web. Eventually it succeeded. Taking heart from the spider's efforts, Robert the Bruce returned to Scotland and eventually regained his crown.

You'll take a boat out to the island and explore by foot today, visiting the bird sanctuary and discovering the lighthouses on the island's east and west coasts. At certain times of year you may even spot the resident island Puffins!
